Caps should be left on all bottles</p> <p>#1 plastic (PET) caps attached</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Soft drink bottles, water bottles, juice bottles, liquor bottles, cooking oil bottles, peanut butter containers, dish soap bottles, mouth wash bottles, clear egg cartons, bakery, clamshells, trays, oven/microwavable trays <p>#2 plastics (HDPE) caps attached</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Plastic juice, milk, laundry soap, shampoo, and windshield washer containers (Acceptable if there is no skull symbol; if there is skull symbol it goes to Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)) <p>#4, #5, & #6 plastics</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yogurt containers, margarine tubs and lids Clean flower pots, trays, planters coded #2 and #5 <p>Aluminum foil wrap Aluminum plates and trays Aluminum cans Containers (i.e. frozen juice Containers) Fast food cups/coffee cups (not Styrofoam) Glass bottles (clear and coloured) Milk and juice cartons, rinsed Metal food and beverage cans, rinsed Metal paint cans - empty, dry, lid removed Plastic clam shell containers Plates, pots, pans Prescription bottles and vials (2 inches or greater) Spiral wound frozen food (i.e. juice concentrate) Tetra Pak boxes</p> <p>The preferred recycling container color is blue with the recycling symbol.
