Community Garden Requirements

General Advice

Any person that uses community gardens should do so in accordance with the following requirements:

Entrance Restrictions:

- Prohibit access to anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 or has had close contact with a confirmed case.
- Restrict access to registered members, staff, and volunteers.
 Non-members and visitors should not be permitted to enter.
- Permit access for planting, maintenance and harvesting food only.
- 4. Prohibit events such as flower festivals, children's events and other programming, training, group builds, etc.

Maintain Physical Distancing:

- Maintain a distance of at least 2 metres (6 feet) from other people except for members of the same household.
- 2. Limit the number of gardeners in a space to ensure physical distancing can be maintained, if required. Groups of people at a site limited to 5 or less.

Ensure Good Hand Hygiene:

 If hands are visibly soiled, handwashing with soap and water is preferred. Where possible, provide handwashing stations in the gardens.

- 2. If not available, hands should be wiped clean before applying alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Perform hand hygiene before entering and upon leaving the garden.

Bring Disinfectant Supplies:

- Recommend users bring disinfectant supplies such as water, soap, hand sanitizer and towels.
- Provide instructions on cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces which are most likely to be contaminated. These may include hoses, door/gate handles, tools, etc. (refer to Resources Section below).

Avoid Sharing Gloves and Tools:

- 1. Bring your own gloves and tools and do not return gloves to any shared storage.
- 2. Instruct individuals who use gardening gloves to launder them after each use.

Signage:

 Place clear, visible signage at all garden entrances reminding registered members, staff and volunteers about the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 and where to seek assistance if they have symptoms (Ontario's selfassessment tool, health care provider or Telehealth Ontario [1-866-797-0000]).



2. Place clear, visible signage throughout the garden — especially locations where shared equipment, tools, etc. are located — reminding registered members, staff and volunteers of the requirements that must be followed when using the garden to prevent the transmission of COVID-19.

Communication:

- Recommend gardens develop and communicate (to registered members, staff and volunteers) COVID-19 policies/protocols that are specific to the community garden.
- Update the list of current registered members, staff and volunteers, and track those who have agreed to participate under COVID-19 policies and protocols.
- Consider using a sign-in and signout system to track users accessing the garden each day. This may assist with communication and close-contact tracing if required, etc.
