SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update - May 16

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on May 16, 2020, at 9:00 am regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Lambton Public Health has confirmed that two additional outbreaks have been declared within the Sarnia-Lambton Area since yesterday, Marshall Gowland Manor in Sarnia and an unidentified retirement facility, that will be publically identified once family members have been notified.

The administration team of Marshall Gowland Manor learned that a resident tested positive for the COVID-19 virus yesterday evening, and are diligently following all of the policies and protocols put in place by the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Long Term Care in order to prevent further spread of COVID-19.

We would like to remind our citizen's that the City's Off Leash Dog Park in Germain Park remains closed and will be opening upon completion of preseason maintenance, which has been delayed due to inclement weather. For those who wish to seek an alternative, the privately owned Blackwell Trails Off Leash Dog Park is now open. As we continue to see nicer weather in our area, we encourage the public to participate in individual physical fitness while taking advantage of public open spaces.
