SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update – May 19

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on May 19, 2020, at 9:15 am regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Government of Ontario in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health, has extended all <u>Emergency Orders</u> currently in place until May 29, 2020.

Effective today, the Province is officially entering the first sage of its <u>Framework for Reopening the Province</u>. Please continue to monitor the <u>list of essential workplaces</u> and <u>https://covid-19.ontario.ca/</u> for up to date information in regard to the current situation in our Province.

As the economy begins to reopen, we remind citizens to continue following public health measures, such as maintaining physical distancing by staying 2 metres apart from others, washing hands regularly, and staying home if feeling unwell.

Regarding the COVID-19 situation in Lambton County, current statistics are available on the <u>Lambton Public Health website</u>, including a detailed <u>community snapshot</u>.
