The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on May 24, 2020, at 9:00 am regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The City of Sarnia encourages the community to get outdoors and enjoy the beautiful parks, beaches and trails the City has to offer, however it remains imperative that citizens do not treat these spaces as destinations and avoid congregating or gatherings. To that end, City Bylaw Enforcement and Sarnia Police Service will be increasing its foot and bike patrols along the beach front park amenities.

Mayor Mike Bradley echoed the comments of other Mayors throughout Ontario in stating, "Our medical professionals are working day and night and putting their lives at risk for the protection of our community and all citizens. Disobeying Provincial laws and guidelines which are for the protection of us all, undermines the months of sacrifices made by everyone. The Primary Control Group monitors daily the respect and compliance by the public of the Provincial Orders. No one wants to close the very amenities that we all wish to now responsibly enjoy, however there are a few that lack compliance. Don't abuse it or lose it."

It is also extremely important to keep in mind the <u>Provincial orders and</u> <u>directives</u> that remain in place, which state restrictions on social gatherings of more than five people.

The City is receiving an increase in concerns and complaints regarding noncompliance with respect to the above noted directives. It remains imperative that all citizens act responsibly. We appreciate everyone's efforts, and together we must continue to do our part in limiting the spread of COVID -19 in our community.

City Council has made some difficult and fiscally responsible decisions to date, including but not limited to delaying or cancelling non-essential projects and not hire summer students and seasonal staff. As a result, some seasonal programs may be cancelled and/or not operating as usual. City staff continue to work hard to maintain public spaces and amenities to the best of our abilities with limited resources.
