SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update – May 26

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on May 26, 2020, at 9:00 a.m. regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Lambton Public Health confirmed an outbreak at Lambton Meadowview Villa in Petrolia with one staff member testing positive for COVID-19.

The Government of Ontario has extended all <u>Emergency Orders</u> currently in place until May 29, 2020.
