SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update – June 8

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on June 8, 2020, at 9:15 a.m. regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Government of Ontario has now confirmed that effective this Friday, June 12, 2020, the Province will increase the limit on social gatherings from five to ten people across the Province, regardless of whether a region has moved to Stage 2 for reopening.

All places of worship in Sarnia-Lambton will be permitted to open with physical distancing in place and attendance limited to no more than 30 per cent of the building capacity to ensure the safety of worshippers.

At this time, the Government of Ontario has excluded Sarnia-Lambton from Stage 2 re-opening. Details regarding this decision can be found here:

The City's top priority continues to be the safety and well-being of the citizens of Sarnia. The SPCG continue to have daily discussions on the reopening process for the City of Sarnia. Until further direction is received from the Province, our community is being asked to remain vigilant.

Citizens are reminded to continue in helping stop the spread of COVID-19 by practicing physical distancing, staying at least two metres apart from those outside their immediate household, washing hands thoroughly and frequently, and, if physical distancing is a challenge, wearing a face covering.
