The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on June 13, 2020, at 9:00 a.m. regarding developments related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Provincial Government has eased restrictions on wedding and funeral ceremonies. Wedding and funeral ceremonies taking place outdoors will be limited to 50 attendees, and indoor ceremonies will be limited to a maximum of 30 per cent of the venue capacity. For both indoor and outdoor ceremonies those attending must follow proper health and safety advice, including practising physical distancing from people who are not from the same household or their established 10-person social circle. The washrooms located north of the Lambton Area Water Supply System (LAWSS) water treatment plant's west parking lot, is now available for use daily from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Municipal parking lots associated with beaches and additional washroom facilities reopened on Friday. On Friday the limit on social gatherings increased from five to ten people, for all regions regardless of whether a region has moved to Stage 2 for reopening. <u>Ontarians are encouraged to establish Social Circles</u>.

All places of worship in Sarnia-Lambton are now permitted to open with physical distancing in place and attendance limited to no more than 30 per cent of the building capacity to ensure the safety of worshippers.

In light of the easing of these restrictions, we remind residents that physical distancing and other safety measures aimed at stopping the spread of COVID-19 should not be eased.
