SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update – July 6

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on July 6, 2020, at 9:30 a.m. regarding developments related to the COVID-19.

Lambton County's Medical Officer of Health, Dr. Ranade, will provide a local COVID-19 update at the beginning of County Council's open session at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, July 8, 2020. County Council meetings are livestreamed through the <u>Streamed Council Meetings</u> link on lambtononline.ca.

Due to COVID-19, cooling centers are limited. The City of Sarnia has taken a disciplined, responsible and measured approach at implementing precautionary measures to protect citizens and Staff from COVID-19. This approach is guiding decision-making in regards to reopening facilities in the weeks and months ahead. A risk assessment tool developed by the City helps determine what amenities should reopen and when. The risk model uses Sarnia-Lambton specific data, reflecting guidance from Lambton Public Health and the ongoing Provincial Emergency Orders.
