The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met via teleconference on July 17, 2020, at 9:30 a.m. regarding developments related to the COVID-19.

Lambton Public Health has confirmed one additional COVID-19 case has been reported, bringing the total to 288. Currently, there are three active COVID-19 cases in Sarnia-Lambton.

Starting today a Pedestrian Friendly Zone will be created by closing Christina Street from George to Davis at 4:00 PM until 8 PM on Sunday. This street closure will allow merchants to utilize the entire sidewalk for their wares/patios and the street will be a space in which people can move freely and safely.

Front Street, as well as George, Lochiel, Davis, and Wellington Street will remain open to allow for traffic flow and access to parking. To support residents and visitors with mobility challenges we've added temporary accessible parking spots during the closure, inside the Parkway lot, next to Scotiabank, access from Front St.

Free parking is also available in the Victoria St Lot & at Ferry Dock Hill. Other municipal lots are free on evenings and weekends, as noted by signage.

<u>Lambton County Council</u> declared its support and encouragement for those who can do so, to wear masks that cover their mouth, nose and chin in public indoor settings where physical distance cannot be achieved. While it is not mandated to wear a mask indoors within public locations, some public buildings and businesses may require it.

Many local establishments have set rules for entry requiring masks, when medically possible. Bluewater Health, along with a number of other local establishments, remain a mandatory masking environment. Employers can assess worker risk of exposure to COVID-19 when considering source control in the workplace.
