SUBJECT: COVID-19 Update

The Sarnia Primary Control Group (SPCG) met today regarding developments related to COVID-19.

In consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health, local medical officers of health, and other health experts, the province has transitioned to the *Keeping Ontario Safe and Open Framework*.

The framework categorizes public health regions into five levels: Green-Prevent, Yellow-Protect, Orange-Restrict, Red-Control, and Lockdown being a measure of last and urgent resort.

While following the advice of Public Health officials, the City of Sarnia is asking residents to pay their respects from home or virtually. To protect the health of our local Veterans and community members, there will be no public ceremony and the public are advised not to gather.

- Tune in to the National Remembrance Day Ceremony
- Observe 2 minutes of silence at 11 a.m. from wherever you are
- Wear a poppy and support the Legion's <u>Poppy campaign</u>
- Reach out to a Veteran by phone or email to say thank you
- Learn about Remembrance Day and the stories of those we honour:
 - Veterans Affairs Canada
 - Royal Canadian Legion
 - Canadian War Museum
- Sharing your thanks online by using #RemembranceDay
- Send a note to a Veteran through <u>Postcards for Peace</u> (students)
- Submit a photo of a relative or friend to be included on the <u>Virtual Wall</u> of <u>Honour & Remembrance</u>

In honour of Remembrance Day, City offices including City Hall and the Compost Site will be closed on Wednesday, November 11. Sarnia Transit service will run as scheduled.
