Subject: The Sarnia War Remembrance Project

The Sarnia War Remembrance Project is a comprehensive historical record of Sarnia's contributions and sacrifices made during times of war. Initiated in 2012, after years of research, revisions and updates, this third and final edition was completed in 2020.

The Sarnia War Remembrance Project was a volunteer, non-profit undertaking by its author, Mr. Tom Slater.

The Project was initiated when Mr. Slater discovered that no formal record existed of those individuals from Sarnia who had lost their lives while serving in the military during times of war. Sarnia, like thousands of other communities across Canada, had many of its sons and daughters answer the call of duty to serve their country during times of war. These "ordinary" local citizens left the comforts of their homes, as well as their schools, farms, jobs, trades and careers; and they left their loved ones, in response to a nation's call to fight in far off lands.

Mr. Slater's hope is that the courage, fortitude and sacrifices of the fallen and their families will be forever commemorated and remembered.

"I am extremely grateful to those who provided the support necessary to make this project possible: the many individuals that provided information, details and assistance; the generosity of the groups and individuals that provided funding to print copies of the project so that they could be donated throughout the community; editors Lou Giancarlo and Tom St. Amand for sharing their expertise; and especially to the family members of the veterans and the fallen for sharing their memories of sacrifice and loss of their loved ones," said author Tom Slater.
