**NOTICE OF COMPLETION**

**PROJECT OVERVIEW**

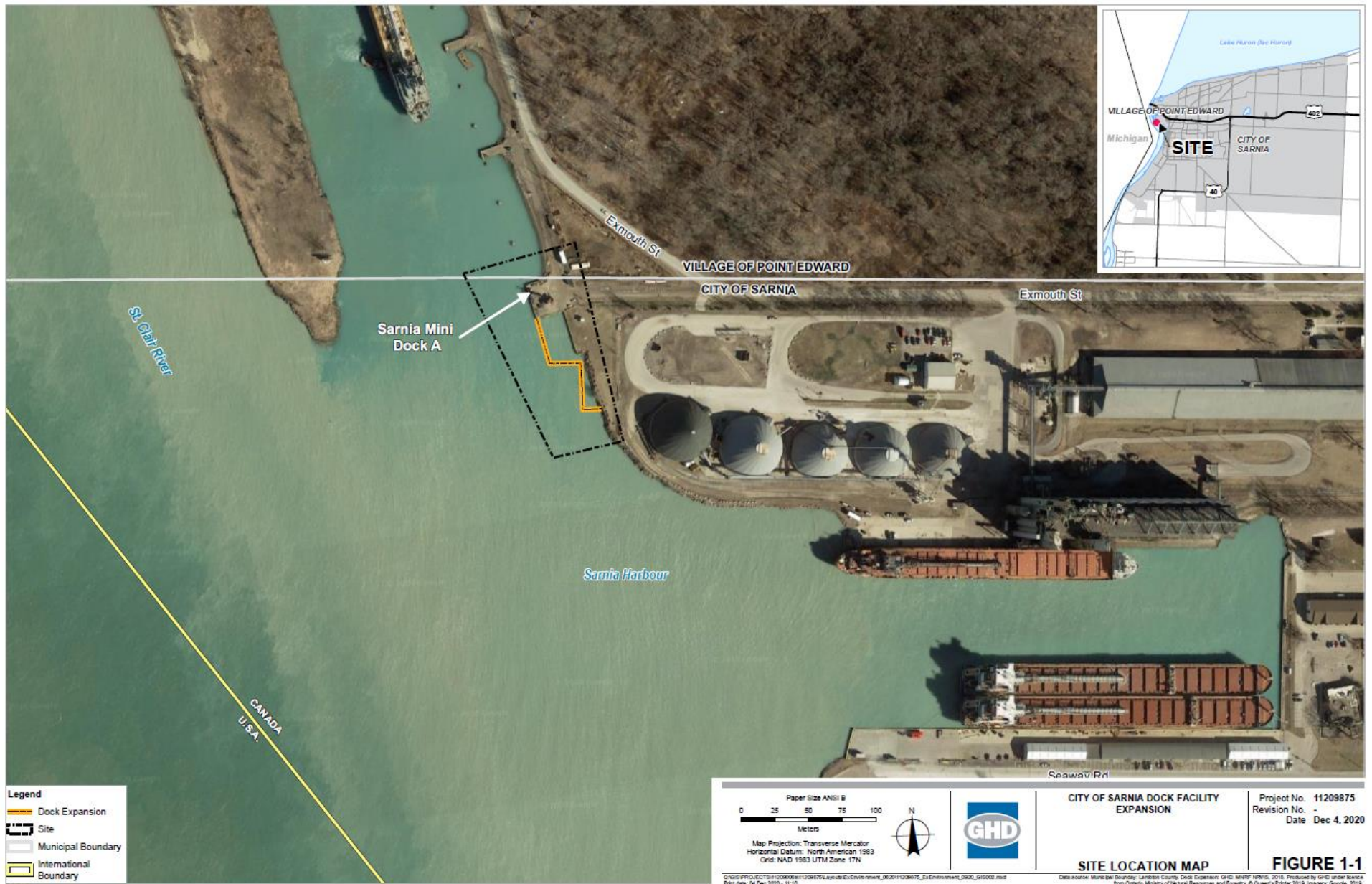


Figure 1-1 Site Location Map

The City of Sarnia (City) has completed the Sarnia Expanded Dock Facility Class Environmental Assessment (Project). As a result, the Preferred Solution of expanding the existing Mini Dock 'A' facility to support the Sarnia-Lambton Oversized Load Corridor (OLC) and provide access to the St. Clair River via the Port of Sarnia has been confirmed (**Figure 1-1**).

**MUNICIPAL CLASS EA PROCESS**

The Project is being carried out in accordance with Schedule 'B' of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (MCEA, October 2000 (as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015)) process. A Project File Report (PFR) has been prepared documenting the MCEA process carried out for the Project. In accordance with the MCEA process, the PFR is being made available for a 30 calendar day comment period starting on **January 29, 2022** and ending on **February 27, 2022** at the following location:
