

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING OF REGISTRATION



An individual, corporation or trade union may file a notice of registration with the Clerk to be a registered third party for the election. The notice must be filed on the prescribed 'Notice of Registration – Form 7' and must include a declaration of qualification signed by the individual or by a representative of the corporation or trade union, as the case may be.

Registrations may be filed in person or by agent with the Clerk during regular business hours between May 2, 2022 and Friday, October 21, 2022.

Third Party Advertisers are required to register with every municipality they wish to advertise in. This also means that each registration is a separate campaign with its own spending limits.

There is no registration fee.

ONLY THE FOLLOWING PERSONS AND ENTITIES ARE ELIGIBLE TO FILE A NOTICE OF REGISTRATION:

1. An individual who is normally resident in Ontario.
2. A corporation that carries on business in Ontario.
3. A trade union that holds bargaining rights for employees in Ontario.

THE FOLLOWING PERSONS AND ENTITIES ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO FILE A NOTICE OF REGISTRATION:

1. A candidate whose nomination has been filed.
2. A federal political party registered under the Canada Elections Act (Canada) or any federal constituency association or registered candidate at a federal election endorsed by that party.
3. A provincial political party, constituency association, registered candidate or leadership contestant registered under the Election Finances Act.
4. The Crown in right of Canada or Ontario, a municipality or local board.

Third party advertisements shall not be under the direction of a candidate whose nomination has been filed.

On the date on which the Clerk certifies the notice of registration, the individual, corporation or trade union is a registered third party for the election.
